

What does Pre-A1 mean?

This means you can:

- · Everyday, familiar words in simple questions and answers when they are spoken slowly and clearly.
- Numbers, prices, dates and days of the week when spoken slowly and clearly in simple questions and answers.
- Simple descriptions of rooms and familiar places with the help of pictures.
- Simple, factual information in short conversations.

What can I do to improve my English?

- Descriptions of people, places, objects and everyday activities.
- Short conversations in everyday situations, for example in shops, restaurants, on transport and in school.
- Important information in announcements in public places and on TV and the radio

What does Pre-A1 mean?

This means you can:

- Recognize familiar everyday words with the help of pictures.
- Understand information about the days, times and locations of events you are being invited to in short letters, cards and emails.
- Understand basic information such as menus with the help of pictures.
- Understand simple personal letters, emails and other short messages.

What can I do to improve my English?

- Practise reading short texts on subjects you are interested in, for example about sports, music, travel and so on.
- Read more short, simple messages sent via social media or e-mail.
- Try to read more simple texts for pleasure, for example short stories with pictures.

Your Speaking Level is: A1.1

What does A1.1 mean?

This means you can:

- Read aloud a short text based on a common situation using some English sounds and stress patterns clearly.
- Answer questions on everyday topics with simple phrases and sentences.
- Describe pictures of familiar scenes with simple phrases and sentences.
- Tell simple stories using basic words and expressions to give information about the people and what they are doing.

What can I do to improve my English?

- Focus on pronouncing all the different sounds in English words more clearly, and on using stress, rhythm and intonation accurately in sentences.
- Learn more words, phrases and expressions so you can ask and answer questions about what you and other people do, wear, feel and think and can describe places and everyday objects in more detail.
- Practise talking about people, places and possessions so you can describe pictures that show everyday scenes and situations in good detail and give your opinion about what is happening.
- Practise talking about what is happening in simple stories that show people in a number of different situations.

What does B1 mean?

This means you can:

- Use in writing a range of vocabulary related to familiar topics and everyday situations.
- Write sentences about familiar situations using the correct grammar.
- Write detailed descriptions of people, places, objects and activities in predictable situations.
- Write and reply to personal letters and messages in good detail in an appropriate style.

What can I do to improve my English?

- Practise writing more detailed texts that combine and evaluate information from different sources.
- Try to write reviews of books, films and plays that show your personal evaluations.
- Learn to write essays, reports and descriptions of complex processes.
- Write texts about advantages and disadvantages, and which explain your opinions in support of or against a different point of view.
