



About the Test

- Burlington VTest for Schools: Ages 11-15 is an English language assessment tool for kids and teenagers, assessing levels from Pre-A1 to C1.
- It is administered online and provides a quick and reliable assessment of learners' English language abilities, mapped to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).
- It is multistage adaptive the difficulty level of questions is adjusted to each learner, based on their performance.

Why Ages 11-15?

- Burlington VTest for Schools is aimed at two separate age groups: 7-10 and 11-15.
- These age groups follow the CEFR, which has produced two documents drawn from European Language Portfolios and other sources.

Structure & Content


- The test is modular there are separate sections for Listening, Reading, Speaking, and Writing. They can be taken individually, or in any combination. Our tests are designed to offer students maximum flexibility.

Uses

- A placement tool to determine where your students' capabilities lie across all four skills.
- A progress monitoring tool during the school year.
- An exit or graduation assessment towards the end of the school year.

Scores & Certificates

- All learners receive a score report, a certificate, and feedback, irrespective of their level.
- Results are reported as an overall score, and skills are reported in detail separately, along with a report containing 'Can Do' statements which teachers and learners can use for improvement.
- Schools receive a Group Report, with information regarding the overall level of English language of their learners.
