About the Test

- Burlington VTest for Schools: Ages 7-10 is an online English exam for young learners from Pre-A1 to B1.
- Results are mapped to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).
- Question difficulty adapts to each learner's performance through multi-stage adaptive testing.
- Listening, Reading, Writing, and Speaking sections can be taken individually or in combination.

Why Ages 7-10?

- Burlington VTest for Schools offers separate exams for ages 7-10 and 11-15.
- These age groups reflect CEFR guidance for assessing young learners and teenagers at different stages of development.

Structure & Content

- Engaging, age-appropriate tasks based on familiar real-world situations.
- See page 2 for task types and timing.

Uses

- Place students at appropriate levels across all four skills.
- Monitor progress throughout the school year.
- Assess achievement towards the end of the school year.

Scores & Certificates

- All learners receive a score report, certificate, and feedback, regardless of level.
- Results include an overall score, individual skill scores, and 'Can do' statements to support further learning.
- A1 and A2 scores provide more precise information about learners' abilities.
- Schools organize, filter, compare, and analyze assessment data according to their structure and priorities.

- No pass or fail – every learner receives a meaningful result.
- Objective, CEFR-based assessment of each learner's English.
- Fast results help teachers and learners set clear learning goals.
- Results highlight strengths and areas for further development.

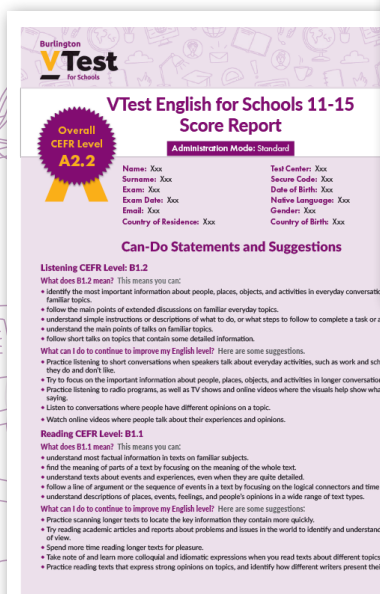
More Than an Exam

Part	# of items	Time
Part 1: Picture matching (Pre-A1)	5	± 2 min
Part 2: Short dialogue multiple choice (Pre-A1 and A1)	5	± 5 min
Part 3: Hotspot matching (Pre-A1 to A2)	5	± 3 min
Part 4: Matching (A1 to B1)	5	3-5 min depending on level



Reading section overview

Part	# of items	Time
Part 1: Sentence matching (Pre-A1)	5	± 2 min
Part 2: Picture choice (Pre-A1 and A1)	5	± 3 min
Part 3: 2-column matching (Pre-A1 to A2)	5	± 2 min
Part 4: 3-option multiple choice (A1 to B1)	5	± 3 min



Speaking section overview

Part	# of items	Time
Part 1: Rejoinders	6 or 12 depending on level	3-6 min
Part 2: Picture description	5	± 3 min
Part 3: Picture story	1 four-picture sequence + 1 follow-up question	± 3 min
Part 4: Open-ended question	1	± 2 min



Writing section overview

Part	# of items	Time
Part 1: Word order	6 or 12 depending on level	4-9 min
Part 2: Picture response	3	± 5 min
Part 3: Open-ended writing	1 prompt	± 6 min
