- recognize when a text provides factual information, and when it intends to convince or persuade the reader of something
- use a variety of strategies to help understand a text, including using contextual clues to identify the main points and to check understanding
- understand personal letters, emails, and other texts even when some colloquial or idiomatic language is used
- recognize how texts are structured, for example when they present contrasting arguments, or offer problems and solutions, or deal with cause and effect
- scan quickly through longer and more complex texts to find the most relevant details

How can I improve my English?
Here are some suggestions. Read

- longer articles, stories, or other texts on unfamiliar topics, and identify the main ideas, important details, and the writer's point of view
- blogs, online discussions, reviews, and similar texts, paying attention to how writers express opinions, attitudes, and emotions directly or indirectly
- texts written for different audiences and purposes, and notice how the language changes depending on how formal or informal the situation is

How can I improve my English?

- Focus on pronouncing English clearly and comfortably, and on using appropriate intonation in less familiar words and longer sentences.
- Build your vocabulary by learning common word combinations and expressions that you can use in a wide range of situations.
- Choose familiar topics and try to describe people, places, events, and experiences in detail.
- Take an active part in discussions about familiar topics by commenting on what other people say, explaining your point of view, comparing different suggestions, and talking about what might or could happen.
