What does A1.2 mean?

This means you can

- identify when people give important and specific information, for example, about places, dates, and times
- understand simple descriptions of rooms, familiar places, and objects with the help of pictures
- understand important information about people, their likes and dislikes, and everyday activities in short conversations when speakers speak slowly and clearly

How can I improve my English?

Here are some suggestions:

- Listen to short conversations with speakers talking about everyday activities, such as work and school, or what they do and don't like.
- Try to focus on the important information about people, places, objects, and activities in longer conversations.
- Listen to radio programs, TV shows, and online videos where the visuals help show what people are saying.

What does A1.1 mean?

This means you can read and understand

- the main points of a short, simple text with the help of pictures
- short texts on a number of subjects of personal interest, such as news, travel, or music, when they are written with simple words and supported by illustrations or pictures
- simple text messages or emails, for example, those with details such as what to do, or when and where to meet
- short, illustrated stories about everyday activities described in simple words

How can I improve my English?

Here are some suggestions:

- Read short, simple personal emails, text messages, and letters on a range of topics, written by friends, family, and other people you know.
- Read short stories and descriptions about people and their lives.
- Read short texts that focus on everyday situations, such as news reports or simple articles, and find the important factual information.
- Spend more time reading stories for pleasure.

What does A2.1 mean?
This means you can

- spell a range of words and phrases about basic and familiar situations correctly
- use simple grammatical structures with some control
- write short, simple stories based on pictures and using your own ideas
- write notes, emails, and text messages to friends, family, and other people, for example replying to questions, and making or accepting invitations

How can I improve my English?
Here are some suggestions:

- Write short, simple stories about real or imaginary events and people, adding details about what happened and how people felt.
- Write emails, text messages, and personal letters to people you know to share news, describe things that have happened, and talk about plans for the future.
- Write detailed descriptions of people, places, and events, and include what you think or feel about them.



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Speaking CEFR Level:

What does A2.2 mean?
This means you can

- pronounce familiar words and phrases clearly, and generally use correct stress, rhythm, and intonation
- answer a range of questions about everyday objects, places, and activities that people do
- describe people, places, possessions, daily routines, and everyday activities shown in pictures, and give a simple opinion about what you see
- tell a very short story using a range of words and phrases in simple grammatical structures

How can I improve my English?
Here are some suggestions:

- Focus on pronouncing English sounds clearly and comfortably, using the right intonation and stress patterns in words and sentences so what you say is easier to understand.
- Learn new words, phrases, and expressions to help you talk about more topics and a wider range of familiar situations in greater detail.
- Describe what is happening in pictures of everyday situations and give your opinion about what you see.
- Practice telling simple stories and describing events in the order they happen.
